Update-Boil Water Advisory English Turn and Lower Coast Algiers

Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans crews have been working around the clock to restore service to the English Turn and Lower Coast Algiers areas. As a result of this work water pressure has significantly improved.

In addition, the Board has begun the process of collecting and testing water samples from throughout the affected areas. These samples will be incubated for 24-hours and test results will be available Wednesday afternoon.

Public health remains the absolute top priority and the Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans is in constant communication with the state Department of Health and Hospitals. Residents and businesses are advised that the Boil Water Advisory issued on Monday, June 1st. will remain in effect until further notice and that they are to continue boiling water until the Boil Water Advisory is lifted.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR BOILING

Boil water for one full minute in a clear container. The one minute boil time begins after the water has been brought to a rolling boil. (If there is a flat taste, it can be eliminated by shaking the water in a bottle or pouring it from one container to another).
