Low Water Pressure/ Traffic Advisory – Uptown, Downtown, French Quarter, Warehouse District

Residents and businesses in a large section of the city may experience low water pressure beginning on 6 a.m. Monday, November 9, 2015 until 6 p.m. on Wednesday, November 11, 2015. Sewerage and Water Board crews will be performing valve work on a 50-inch water main.

The work is needed to prepare the water main for relocation and tie-in as a part of the SELA Drainage Project.

Efforts will be directed towards minimizing impact on our customers, but it will be helpful for customers experiencing problems during this work to report them by calling 52WATER (529-2837).

Affected Areas May Include:

- Carrollton
- Uptown
- Central Business District
- Mid-City
- Ninth Ward
- New Orleans East

In addition, motorists, residents and businesses are also advised that beginning at 9 a.m. on Monday, November 9, 2016 until 12 noon, the middle and right lane will be closed to vehicular traffic on the lake bound side of Canal Street from N. Pierce Street to N. Carrollton Avenue.

Motorists will have access to the Walgreens entrance off of Canal Street. The right lane on N. Carrollton Avenue to the Walgreens entrance will be closed.
