Nolan P. Lambert, who has served in numerous key positions with the City Attorneys Office since 1993, has been named Special Counsel of the Sewerage & Water Board of New Orleans by its Board of Directors.

He will also, among many other duties, prepare legislation, by-laws, rules and legislation, which affect the Board's operations. He will head a team of attorneys handling a variety of cases involving litigation, land acquisition and rights-of-way, contracts and employment and insurance matters.
